



Fitzroy Crossing is 114m above sea level and is surrounded by the flood plains of the Fitzroy River. It has an average annual rainfall of 702.55mm mostly falling between December and March. The average maximum temperature is 35.9°C with a minimum of 20.1°C. The 350 million year old Devonian Reef as seen at Geikie Gorge provides the major landform contrast in the area. Pastoralism, tourism, mining and Aboriginal enterprises are the major industries in the area. Lead and zinc are mined at Cadjebut between Fitzroy Crossing and Halls Creek.
